Updated MMSEA Section 111 User Guide Issued

The MMSEA Section 111 statutory language (42 U.S.C. § 1395y(b)(8)) for the liability insurance (including self-insurance), no-fault insurance, and workers ' compensation provisions can be found in the NGHP User Guide Appendices Chapter V. Section 111 authorizes CMS ' implementation of the required reporting by program instruction or otherwise.

MMSEA Section 111 User Guide, Version 5.6, July 1, 2019 Chapter II (Registration Procedures), Section 4.2.2: CMS has added clarification that Responsible Reporting Entities (RRE) should submit one Claim Input file per quarter. However, also noted in the guide, is mention that CMS will still accept multiple Claim Input Files per quarter.

Access to the records matched and to any records created by the matching process shall be restricted to authorized CMS and RRE employees, agents and officials who require access to perform their official duties in accordance with the uses of the information as authorized under Section 111 of the MMSEA of 2007.
