The Job Descriptive Index (JDI) was originally developed by Smith, Kendall, and Hulin (1969) to measure job satisfaction defined as "the feelings a worker has about his job" (p. 100). This instrument has been revised in 1985, 1997, and most recently in 2009.

Through the combination of ratings of satisfaction with the faces, a composite measure of job satisfaction is determined.

Efforts are under way to offer online administration, scoring, interpretation, and report writing that are completely automated, a service that may be particularly helpful for midsized organizations that lack the expertise to do their own survey work.
