Need materials for your Pre-A guided reading lessons? Pre-A lessons can require a lot of preparation and "stuff!" I created my Pre-A guided reading activity binders to save myself some prep time. First, I make a binder for each student in the group. (However, the binder is not specific to one particular student. If I have two Pre-A groups with 3 students in each group, I only make 3 binders, not 6.)**

What does a Pre-A guided reading lesson look like ...
Assessment: Prior To Pre-A Guided Reading Lessons. Before we can begin planning our Pre-A guided reading lessons, we need to assess our students to know what they know and where they need help. We use ESGI to our assessment. ESGI is a computer based, one on one assessment tool that makes assessing fast and easy.

This is a weekly lesson plan document for guided reading Pre-A lessons. Great for Pre-K, kindergarten, and SPED students (that are severely behind). Optional Guided Writing (If appropriate): After students finish reading the book, help them expand their understanding of the text by writing with the teacher's support for 20 minutes. Recommended for struggling writers.

Pre-A Lesson Plan - Guided Reading 101
This is guided reading, after all. In advance, prepare a teaching point, discussion questions, and (if desired) an extension such as word work or guided writing. Before the students begin reading, introduce the text. You might introduce new concepts or vocabulary words, give a brief synopsis of the book, call attention to a new phonics pattern ...

Before, during & after guided reading activities - The ...
Guided reading is a small-group instructional context in which a teacher supports each reader's development of systems of strategic actions for processing new texts at increasingly challenging levels of difficulty. During guided reading, students in a small-group setting individually read a text that you have selected at their instructional reading level.
